1. Weather in June

- Season: Malawi is in its winter in June. This year's winter promises to be colder than average.
- Temperatures: Average temperatures range from 10°C (50°F) in the mornings/evenings to 23–26°C (73–79°F) during the day.
- What to pack:
 - » Light sweaters or jackets for evenings/mornings
 - » Comfortable clothing for daytime

2. Security & Safety

- Malawi is generally peaceful, but as with all international travel:
 - » Be vigilant in public spaces and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
 - » Use registered taxis or transport arranged by the organizers.
 - » Follow local and hotel security advice.
 - » Emergency contact numbers and security liaison officers will be provided below.

3. Visa & Immigration

- Most participants will require visas.
- Visit the Malawi Immigration Department websites (<https://www.immigration.gov.mw/visa/>) and (<https://evisa.gov.mw/>) to see visa requirements
- Keep a printed copy of your invitation letter and accommodation booking for immigration.

4. Health & Medical

- **COVID-19:** No recent restrictions, but guests should check their airline's requirements.
- **Vaccinations:** Yellow fever certificate only required if coming from a yellow fever endemic country.
- **Malaria:** Lilongwe is a low-risk area, but taking antimalarial precautions is advised.
- Bring personal medication and basic travel meds.
- AAP will share contacts for nearby clinics and emergency services.

5. Currency & Payments

- **Currency:** Malawian Kwacha (MWK)
- **Exchange:** Available at the airport and local banks.
- **Cards:** Credit/debit cards accepted in major hotels and some stores; cash is preferred in many places.
- It's best to carry small denominations of cash.

6. Connectivity

- **SIM cards** (Airtel or TNM) are available at the airport or shopping centers.
- Most hotels offer **free Wi-Fi**.
- Hotel teams can assist in setting up connectivity.

7. Transport & Local Movement

- Airport pickup and drop off will be arranged for official guests.
- Transport to and from the event venues will be provided.
- For private movement, use hotel approved taxis.

8. Cultural Etiquette

- Malawi is known as the "Warm Heart of Africa."
- Greetings are important—shaking hands is common.
- Dress modestly in formal settings and events.

9. Event Locations

- Main venues will be:
 - LUANAR Campus (Bunda)
 - President's Hotel (City Center, Lilongwe)
- Exact venue addresses and maps will be provided upon arrival.



10. Plugs and Electricity

Malawi uses the **Type G** plug, which is the same type used in the United Kingdom. If you're traveling to Malawi with devices that don't use Type G plugs, you'll need a plug adapter.

Malaria Colloquium

In 1985, the founding Dean of the Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine (MSUCOM) sketched out his vision of having an MSUCOM faculty member carry out research abroad, in a setting that would be suitable for medical student electives. In 1986, Terrie Taylor (MSUCOM) and Malcolm Molyneux (Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine) began work on severe Malaria in Malawian children at the Queen Elizabeth Central Hospital (QECH). The first medical students arrived in Malawi in 1987, and the research and the medical student electives programs have continued over the past 24 years.

The goal of this colloquium is to simultaneously celebrate the contributions of the Paediatric Research Ward (PRW) to our understanding of malaria pathogenesis and to the careers of many biomedical scientists. We hope this will be inspiring to the up-and-coming Malawian investigators so that they see that the paths to productive careers in science are many and varied!


